Netflix compares data representing a **segment of the body of information** (e.g., data relating to the movie or television program item being viewed) to data representing a **different segment of the body of information** (e.g., data related to other movie or television program items), according to one or more predetermined criteria, to determine whether the segments are related.

It appears that the computer readable medium comprises the recited instructions. However, Plaintiff requires access to source code to precisely identify the comparison instructions.

instructions for generating a display of a portion of, or a representation of, a second segment of the body of information from data that is part of the stored data, wherein the display of the portion or representation of the second segment is generated in response to the display of a first segment to which the second segment is related.

Netflix generates a display of a portion of, or a representation of, a **second segment of the body of information** in response to the display of a **first segment of information** to which the **second segment** is related. It appears that the computer readable medium comprises the recited instructions. However, Plaintiff requires access to source code to precisely identify the instructions that cause the display of a portion of, or representation of, a second segment to be generated in response to the display of a first segment.
