
7 April 2021 Webinar:

"An urgent call to work together to tackle health inequities"



07 April 2021, 14.00 - 15.30 CET

World Health Day 2021 will mark health equity and will be the starting point for a year-long equity campaign aiming to **bring people together to build a fairer, healthier world**. COVID-19 has illuminated and magnified health inequities. Based on current socioeconomic analyses, inequalities are predicted to increase in the future, further threatening health equity and the right to health of all persons. WHD 2021 calls for urgent action to tackle health inequities, with a focus on COVID-19 and building back fairly.

This virtual gala event "An urgent call to work together to tackle health inequities" is organized by WHO and is the 'launch' event for WHD 2021. It is part of a series of webinar and capacity building events being convened under the umbrella of World Health Day by different WHO departments and Regional Offices throughout 2021. The virtual event will be opened by the WHO Director-General, followed by a moderated panel discussion on the topic: How inequities are being magnified in the current COVID-19 context, what is needed to change this, and how we can build back fairly.

The panel will be moderated by **Professor Pascale Allotey**, Director, International Institute for Global Health United Nations University. Panelists will speak for 5 minutes each:

- **2. Professor Cesar Victora**, Emeritus Professor Epidemiology, Federal University of Pelotas, Brazil on disaggregated health data and health inequality monitoring.
- 3. Dr Sana Contractor Independent consultant, Convenor, COPASAH Sexual and Reproductive Rights Hub, CHSJ, New Delhi, India and an Alumnus (2016) Emerging Voices - on trust and accountability between health systems and communities.
- 4. Dr Jeanette Vega Senior Adviser, Health Innovation and Digital Transformation, Red de Salud UC-CHRISTUS, Chile on civil society action, including the role of digital technologies.
- 5. Professor Michael Marmot Director, Institute of Health Equity, UCL Department of Epidemiology & Public Health - on the need to build on the COVID-19 response to catalyse action.



There will then be a moderated discussion. All panelists will make a closing comment and the event will be closed by Professor Allotey.
