The Floss Rule



If a one-syllable word

has only one vowel

and ends in f, l, or s,

double the last letter.

<i>moss</i>	<i>sniff</i>	<i>kiss</i>	<i>stuff</i>
<i>bill</i>	<i>cliff</i>	<i>fill</i>	<i>glass</i>

Some exceptions:

If the final s makes the /z/ sound, don't double it:

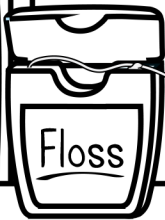
as, is, was, has, and his

Here are some common words that *don't* follow the Floss Rule:

if, gas, yes, this, us, bus, plus, chef, and gal



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
