INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS  
NEW YORK, 16 DECEMBER 1966

PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)<sup>1</sup>

**The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:**

**The above action was effected on 7 February 2024.**

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 13-2024-PCM, published on 6 February 2024, the Government of Peru extended the state of national emergency declared by Supreme Decree No. 23-2023-PCM in the provinces of Putumayo and Mariscal Castilla of the department of Loreto for a period of sixty (60) calendar days starting on 13 February 2024. The measure was declared owing to the illegal activities of criminal organizations involved in illicit drug trafficking, illegal mining and related offences in the aforementioned provinces.
- During the state of emergency, the constitutional rights relating to liberty and security of person, inviolability of the home, and freedom of assembly and movement in the territory, included in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, are suspended.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
