This letter will serve to advise the IEEE 802.11n Standard for Enhancements for Higher Throughput Task Group of the IP statement by Philips Semiconductors Inc. (hereafter "Philips") relating to Philips' Task Group proposal.

Philips IP Statement for 802.11n

Philips will, upon written request of any company (the "requester"), grant it a personal, non-exclusive license on reasonable and non-discriminatory terms and conditions for only that portion of any product that is fully compliant with the IEEE 802.11n standard, under any existing, pending, and future patents owned or controlled by Philips, under which Philips is free to grant licenses without the consent of or need to account to any third party, which patents would necessarily be directly infringed by the manufacture, sale, and use of the product solely because it is fully compliant with the IEEE 802.11n standard, provided that a similar license under the requester's patents is made available to Philips and its affiliates (i.e. any company, corporation or other entity which now or hereafter directly or indirectly through one or more intermediaries is controlled by, controlling or under common control with Philips). An entity shall be regarded as in control of another so long as it owns or controls, directly or indirectly, at least fifty percent (50%) of the shares entitled to vote for the election of directors or other persons performing similar functions.
