Reference is made to my letter dated October 20, 1976, relating to information indicating that the name of Special Agent Joseph S. Leo of this Bureau, Legal Attache, Caracas, Venezuela, was found in the possession of one of the individuals arrested as a suspect in the loss of Cubina Airlines Flight Number 455 in the Caribbean Sea on October 6, 1976.

For your further information and assistance, there is set forth below additional facts reported to this Headquarters on October 26, 1976, by Legat Leo,

Jan Mich Hernan Ricardo Lozano and Freddy Lugo, citizens of Venezuela, were arrested by the police of Trinidad and Tobago on October 7, 1976, on suspicion of implication in the crash of the Cuban-operated aircraft off the coast of Barbados on October 6, 1976. Hernan Ricardo Lozano came to the attention of Legat, Caracas, during the summer of 1975 when he contacted Legat

Ricardo Lozano returned shortly thereafter to express his apprectation for that assistance and he recontacted Legat, Caracas, on approximately three other occasions relating to visa information. In December, 1975, Ricardo Lozano telephoned Legat Assoc. Dir.
