Through our subsidiary, the Chicago, Central & Pacific Railroad, CN's rails stretch the breadth of Iowa, from the Missouri River in the west to the Mississippi in the east. We carry a wide variety of manufactured and industrial products like food, machinery, electrical equipment, chemical products and primary metals. In addition to serving local businesses, CN's ethanol franchise is centered in the Hawkeye State with several plants along the route between Dubuque and Sioux City and Council Bluffs. The largest rail yard and facility on CN's Iowa network is in Waterloo.

In December 2023, CN announced an agreement to acquire lowa Northern Railway (IANR), which operates approximately 275 track miles in Iowa connecting to CN's U.S. rail network. The transaction is pending regulatory review by the Surface Transportation Board. A decision is expected in 2024. IANR serves upper Midwest agricultural and industrial markets covering many goods, including biofuels and grain. This transaction represents a meaningful opportunity to support the growth of local business by creating single-line service to North American destinations, while preserving access to existing carrier options.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than US\$300 million to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Iowa and to support our supply chain partners. The program focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus maintenance of bridges, public crossings, culverts, signal systems, and other track infrastructure.

Community Investments

In 2023, CN contributed to several lowa-based organizations, including:

AMERICA IN BLOOM (AIB) CN EcoConnexions contributed to AiB to promote beautification in Dubuque by planting trees and shrubs. Throughout the U.S., AiB and CN completed 13 tree-planting projects in 2023. Together, we have planted more than 70,000 trees, shrubs and perennials since 2014.

BADGER FIRE AND EMS AGENCY The agency's mission is to protect all citizens and visitors from the adverse effects of natural and man-made emergencies through effective emergency response, fire code application and public fire education. CN contributed to the acquisition of battery-powered recue tools such as the "jaws of life."

P.E.O. PROGRAM FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION The P.E.O.
Sisterhood was founded by seven young female students at lowa Wesleyan University in 1869 and has grown to nearly half a million members in the U.S. and Canada. P.E.O. celebrates the advancement of women; educates women through scholarships, grants, awards, loans and stewardship of Cottey College; and motivates women to achieve their highest aspirations.

HAWKEYE COMMUNITY COLLEGE Since Hawkeye opened its doors in 1966, it has focused on meeting the needs of the community, providing quality, affordable training for learners at all stages of life. CN supports Hawkeye's Law Enforcement Academy, which offers certification training to law enforcement agencies that hire college graduates as police officers and reserve officer certification courses.
