CN's network criss-crosses Mississippi, with a rail yard in Jackson serving as a hub for petroleum headed to the western part of the Magnolia State, coal moving east to Alabama, grain shipping south to the Gulf Coast for export, and chemical products headed north to the Midwest. Intermodal products destined throughout North America are handled through our intermodal terminal in Jackson, where more than 350 CN railroaders live and work. Amtrak's *City of New Orleans* service stops in Jackson at CN's rail yard. CN also has an automotive distribution facility serving the Nissan assembly plant in Canton.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than US\$650 million to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Mississippi and to support our supply chain partners. The program focused on the replacement of rail and ties, as well as maintenance of bridges, public crossings, culverts, signal systems and other track infrastructure.
