CN handles consumer goods and other intermodal traffic through our terminal in Moncton, where over 250 CN railroaders live and work. Other CN facilities in Moncton include a major rail classification yard as well as automotive and forest products distribution centres and a CargoFlo® bulk handling facility. CN's network extends to the ports of Belledune and Saint John, where we have another CargoFlo® bulk handling facility.

In partnership with the Port of Saint John, CN is committed to enabling supply chains and facilitating business in Atlantic Canada. Our weekly CN IntelliGen Genset Service moves temperature-sensitive goods between Saint John, NB, and Brampton, ON.

### **Network Investments**

Over the past decade, CN has invested about \$275 million to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in New Brunswick and to support our supply chain partners. The program focused on bridge upgrades, the replacement of rail and ties, plus maintenance of public crossings, culverts, signal systems, and other track infrastructure.



## **Community Investments**

In 2023, CN contributed to many New Brunswick-based organizations, including:

**INTANGIBLE CULTURE AND HERITAGE COUNCIL OF NEW BRUNSWICK** For the third year in a row, CN is proud to be the presenting sponsor of Levee on the Lake, a festival in Sackville promoting local artists, traditional music and the crafts of Indigenous people, new immigrants as well as LGBTQ2+ and BIPOC voices. Through this sponsorship, we are helping to promote, protect and preserve the intangible culture and heritage of New Brunswick.

**CHALMERS FOUNDATION** The Dr. Everett Chalmers Regional Hospital in Fredericton is a centre of expertise for reconstructive and restorative medicine and a certified partner of the Dalhousie University Family Medicine program and the University of New Brunswick nursing program.

**BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB OF SAINT JOHN** CN supports the South End Community Centre, part of the Boys and Girls Club of Saint John. The centre offers three free structured programs (after school, evening and summer), all focused on providing young people with a foundation for building assets.

MADAWASKA MALISEET FIRST NATION Bordering the Appalachian Mountain range and nestled along the Wolastoq River (Saint John River), the Madawaska Maliseet First Nation is a thriving community that prides itself on stable leadership and economic growth. Wolastoqiyik are "people of the beautiful and bountiful river" and their language is Wolastoqey. CN supported "Wolastoqiyik Speaks."

**FOOD DEPOT ALIMENTAIRE** Serving the frontline of hunger, Food Depot Alimentaire is a registered non-profit that supports food banks, community kitchens, school programs and other supportive agencies across New Brunswick. The organization's primary functions include food storage and distribution, fundraising, food collection and advocacy for the people and agencies they serve.
