

Large volumes of traffic are handled in Ontario, much of it at MacMillan Yard — CN's largest rail classification facility and our only hump yard in Eastern Canada. Mac Yard also has railcar and locomotive repair shops. Intermodal containers are handled at CN's biggest terminal in Brampton as well as another nearby. The Toronto area, which is home to over 2,600 CN railroaders, also boasts a distribution facility for automobiles, one for forest products, two for metals, a logistics park, and two CargoFlo® bulk handling facilities. In addition, CN has a forest products distribution centre in Brockville and one for autos in Windsor.

Network Investments

CN remains committed to the Milton Logistics Hub. The \$250-million project is a critical piece of infrastructure in Canada's busiest region, where new capacity is needed to meet fast-growing demand for the necessities of day-to-day life. The Milton Logistics Hub will not only benefit Ontario, but further strengthen the Canadian economy and its strategic advantages. The project was subject to Canada's most extensive environmental review process.

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than \$2.8 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Ontario and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included the transformation of our intermodal operations. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.

Community Investments

In 2023, CN contributed to many Ontario-based organizations, including:

CN CYCLE FOR CHEO We are proud to have once again presented the annual CN Cycle for CHEO in Ottawa. CN employees and their families joined more than 6,300 people who cycled, ran or walked in the biggest fundraiser for the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO). This year's event, our 16th, raised a record total of more than \$1.8 million for children and their families affected by cancer.

WILFRID LAURIER UNIVERSITY CN supports research and education programs at the Centre for Supply Chain Management (SCM) in the Lazaridis School of Business and Economics at Wilfrid Laurier University in Waterloo. CN works closely with SCM to support student internships, develop a cooperative education program where students are employed at CN, establish a CN Fellow in SCM program, and hold an annual conference on supply chain and logistics in Milton.

LEVEL (CHANGING LIVES THROUGH LAW) CN supports Level's Indigenous Youth Outreach Program (IYOP), a program developed in consultation with Indigenous elders and advisors throughout Canada to provide justice education and mentorship for First Nations, Métis and Inuit youth aged 11 to 18 years.

SHELTER MOVERS – OTTAWA CN took part in the Giving Tuesday Campaign in support of Shelter Movers, a national, volunteer-powered charitable organization providing moving and storage services at no cost to individuals and families fleeing abuse. Shelter Movers collaborates with local businesses and community agencies to support people, primarily women and children, as they transition to a life free of violence.

TEAM RUBICON CANADA CN was proud to support Team Rubicon Canada's 2023 Salute to Service event to recognize the work of military veterans who have volunteered their time to communities in need during disasters and crises. Together, we are building safer and stronger communities.
