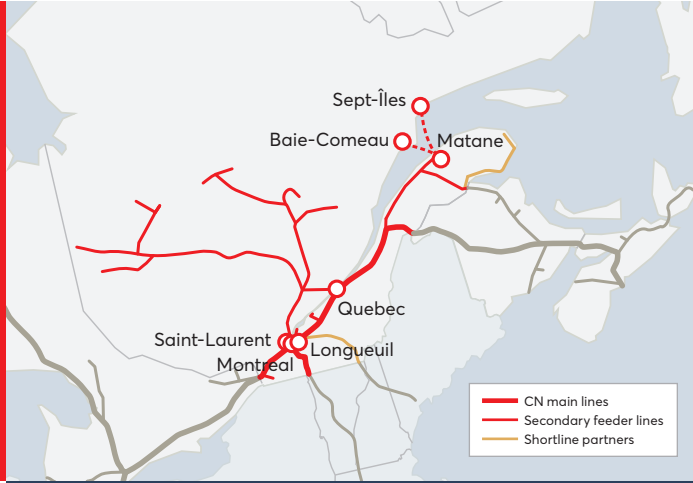

Our extensive rail network stretches across Quebec. Montreal is home to CN's headquarters and close to 2,900 employees as well as a major rail classification yard and repair shops. CN serves the Port of Montreal, where we handle growing numbers of import/export containers. We also have an intermodal terminal in Saint-Laurent. Other CN facilities in Montreal include a logistics park, forest products, automotive and metals distribution centres, and a CargoFlo® bulk handling facility. Quebec City, where over 350 CN railroaders live and work, boasts automotive and forest products distribution centres as well as a large rail classification yard.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than \$3.8 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Quebec and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included the development of several major I&T projects. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.

Community Investments

In 2023, CN contributed to many Quebec-based organizations, including:

MONTREAL CANADIENS The Montreal Canadiens' training facility in Brossard is now known as the CN Sports Complex. The state-of-the-art facility welcomes hockey players, soccer players, and athletes of all disciplines, in addition to hosting community programs.

TERRY FOX FOUNDATION About 155 CN employees and their loved ones came together on September 17 for a classic Canadian tradition: the 43rd annual Terry Fox Run in support of cancer research. Team CN joined hundreds of Montrealers at the Old Port to walk or run the 2.5- or 5-km route under sunny skies. Our long-term partnership with the Terry Fox Foundation is a testimony of our shared resilience and commitment to making a positive impact in the fight against cancer.

SUN YOUTH For the second year in a row, about 20 employees from the Customer Intermodal Solutions & Innovation Team gathered at the Sun Youth community services organization in Montreal to help the needy. The team helped sort pallets of food, toys and clothing for distribution to over 5,000 people every month. CN also made a corporate donation to Sun Youth's Building a Brighter Future campaign toward the construction of their new centre.

L'APPART À MOI L'Appart à Moi (My Apartment) provides vulnerable young adults affected with Down's syndrome or other intellectual disabilities a smooth and harmonious transition to independent living. CN sponsored their annual fundraising gala.

HEALTHCARE IN MONTREAL CN has signed 10-year agreements (2018-2027) to provide stable funding to four of Montreal's top research hospitals: Centre hospitalier de l'Université de Montréal, McGill University Healthcare Centre, Montreal Heart Institute and Centre hospitalier universitaire Sainte-Justine.

PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS CN supports many organizations in Montreal that help people experiencing homelessness, including Le Bon Dieu dans la Rue, Nazareth Community, Chez Doris, La Rue des Femmes, Old Brewery Mission, Native Women Shelter of Montreal, Shield of Athena, and Welcome Hall Mission.
