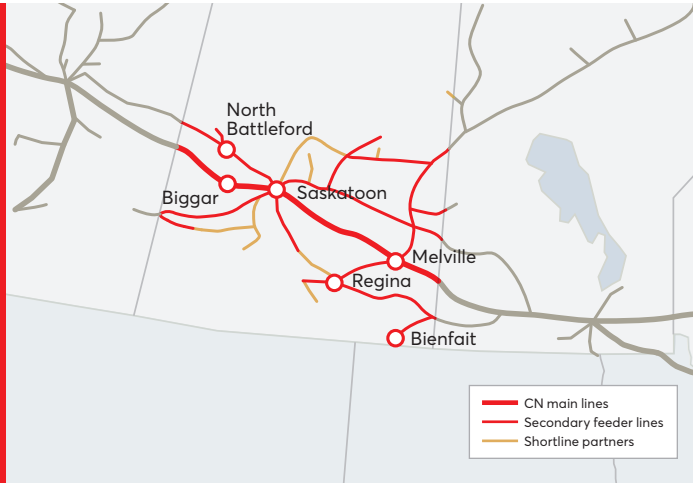

Intermodal

Grains and fertilizers, especially potash, make up most of the traffic handled by CN in this Prairie province. Our traffic also reflects the increasing diversification of the Saskatchewan economy by handling growing volumes of consumer goods and specialty crops through our intermodal terminal in Saskatoon and Canada's first privately operated intermodal terminal in Regina. Both Saskatoon and Bienfait boast metals distribution facilities. Saskatoon, where almost 500 CN railroaders live and work, also has an automotive distribution centre. Melville is home to CN's largest rail classification yard in Saskatchewan and close to 400 CN employees. Finally, in North Battleford, there is an additional forest products distribution facility.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than \$1.5 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Saskatchewan and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included rebuilding bridges and upgrading subdivisions. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.
