To amend statutory damages provisions of title 17, United States Code.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Digital Theft Deter-
- 3 rence and Copyright Damages Improvement Act of 1999".
- 4 SEC. 2. STATUTORY DAMAGES ENHANCEMENT.
- 5 Section 504(c) of title 17, United States Code, is
- 6 amended—
- 7 (1) in paragraph (1)—
- 8 (A) by striking "\$500" and inserting
- 9 "\$750"; and
- 10 (B) by striking "\$20,000" and inserting
- "\$30,000"; and
- 12 (2) in paragraph (2), by striking "\$100,000"
- and inserting "\$150,000".
- 14 SEC. 3. SENTENCING COMMISSION GUIDELINES.
- 15 Within 120 days after the date of the enactment of
- 16 this Act, or within 120 days after the first date on which
- 17 there is a sufficient number of voting members of the Sen-
- 18 tencing Commission to constitute a quorum, whichever is
- 19 later, the Commission shall promulgate emergency guide-
- 20 line amendments to implement section 2(g) of the No
- 21 Electronic Theft (NET) Act (29 U.S.C. 994 note) in ac-
- 22 cordance with the procedures set forth in section 21(a)
- 23 of the Sentencing Act of 1987, as though the authority
- 24 under that Act had not expired.

1 SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- 2 The amendments made by section 2 shall apply to
- 3 any action brought on or after the date of the enactment
- 4 of this Act, regardless of the date on which the alleged
- 5 activity that is the basis of the action occurred.
