A BILL

To fully offset the cost of the extension of unemployment benefits and other Federal aid.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. RESCISSION OF UNSPENT AND UNCOMMITTED

FEDERAL FUNDS.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi6 sion of law, of all available unobligated Federal funds,
7 \$9,200,000,000 in discretionary, unexpired funds are re8 scinded.

(b) IMPLEMENTATION.—Not later than 60 days after
 the date of enactment of this Act, the Director of the Of fice of Management and Budget shall—

4 (1) identify the accounts and amounts rescinded5 to implement subsection (a); and

6 (2) submit a report to the Secretary of the
7 Treasury and Congress of the accounts and amounts
8 identified under paragraph (1) for rescission.

9 SEC. 2. SHORT TITLE.

10 This Act may be cited as the "Continuing Extension11 Act of 2010".

1SEC. 11. COMPENSATION AND RATIFICATION OF AUTHOR-2ITY RELATED TO LAPSE IN HIGHWAY PRO-3GRAMS.

4 (a) Compensation for Federal Employees.— 5 Any Federal employees furloughed as a result of the lapse in expenditure authority from the Highway Trust Fund 6 7 after 11:59 p.m. on February 28, 2010, through March 8 2, 2010, shall be compensated for the period of that lapse 9 at their standard rates of compensation, as determined under policies established by the Secretary of Transpor-10 11 tation.

12 (b) RATIFICATION OF ESSENTIAL ACTIONS.—All ac-13 tions taken by Federal employees, contractors, and grantees for the purposes of maintaining the essential level of 14 15 Government operations, services, and activities to protect 16 life and property and to bring about orderly termination 17 of Government functions during the lapse in expenditure 18 authority from the Highway Trust Fund after 11:59 p.m. 19 on February 28, 2010, through March 2, 2010, are hereby 20 ratified and approved if otherwise in accord with the provi-21 sions of the Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2010 22 (division B of Public Law 111–68).

23 (c) FUNDING.—Funds used by the Secretary to com24 pensate employees described in subsection (a) shall be de25 rived from funds previously authorized out of the Highway

ment of Transportation by the Consolidated Appropria-1 tions Act, 2010 (Public Law 111–117) and shall be sub-2 3 ject to the obligation limitations established in such Act. 4 (d) EXPENDITURES FROM HIGHWAY TRUST 5 FUND.—To permit expenditures from the Highway Trust Fund to effect the purposes of this section, this sec-6 7 tion shall be deemed to be a section of the Continuing Ap-8 propriations Resolution, 2010 (division B of Public Law 9 111–68), as in effect on the date of the enactment of the 10 last amendment to such Resolution.

11 SEC. 12. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—The budgetary effects of this Act, 13 for the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by reference to 14 15 the latest statement titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this Act, submitted for printing in the 16 17 Congressional Record by the Chairman of the Committee on the Budget of the House of Representatives, provided 18 that such statement has been submitted prior to the vote 19 20 on passage.

(b) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION FOR CONGRESSIONAL
ENFORCEMENT.—This Act, with the exception of section
4, is designated as an emergency for purposes of pay-asyou-go principles. In the Senate, this Act is designated
as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 403(a)

of S. Con. Res. 13 (111th Congress), the concurrent reso lution on the budget for fiscal year 2010.

3 (c) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION FOR STATUTORY
4 PAYGO.—This Act, with the exception of section 4, is
5 designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to sec6 tion 4(g) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010
7 (Public Law 111–139; 2 U.S.C. 933(g)).
