DECISION and ORDER

The issue is whether appellant established that she sustained a recurrence of disability, due to her October 30, 1989 employment injury, beginning April 29, 1999.

The Board has given careful consideration to the issue involved, the contentions of the parties on appeal and the entire case record. The Board finds that the June 16, 2000 decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs is in accordance with the facts and the law in this case and hereby adopts the findings and conclusions of the hearing representative.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>1</sup> Appellant did not show that, upon returning to work after the October 30, 1989 employment injury, the nature and extent of her work requirements or the nature and extent of her physical condition changed and the medical evidence did not establish that her current condition was related to the October 30, 1989 employment injury. *See Helen K. Holt*, 50 ECAB 279, 282 (1999); *Carlos A. Marrero*, 50 ECAB 117, 118 (1998).

The June 16, 2000 decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs is hereby affirmed.
