## **ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL**

On February 2, 2021 appellant filed an appeal from a March 27, 2018 nonmerit decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs (OWCP). The Clerk of the Appellate Boards assigned Docket No. 21-0457.

The Board has duly considered the matter and notes that the Board has jurisdiction to review final adverse decisions of OWCP issued under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act.<sup>1</sup> For final adverse decisions of OWCP issued on or after November 19, 2008, the Board's review authority is limited to appeals which are filed within 180 days from the date of issuance of OWCP's decision.<sup>2</sup>

The 180<sup>th</sup> day following the March 27, 2018 decision was September 23, 2018. As appellant did not file an appeal with the Board until February 2, 2021, more than 180 days after the September 23, 2018 OWCP decision, the Board finds that the appeal docketed as No. 21-0457 is untimely filed. The Board is without jurisdiction to review the appeal. Appellant has not offered

a reason to explain the failure to timely file an appeal with supporting documentation sufficient to establish compelling circumstances.

The Board's decisions and orders are "final upon the expiration of 30 days from the date of their issuance."<sup>3</sup>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT the appeal docketed as No. 21-0457 is dismissed.
