

Impact of the Regional Development Policy Committee

The OECD's Regional Development Policy Committee (RDPC) governs the work of the Centre for Entrepreneurship, SMEs, Regions and Cities (CFE). The RDPC and CFE work to improve living standards and well-being in citizens from all regions, cities and rural areas by designing and implementing effective place-based policies:

Role of the Regional Development Policy Committee

Since its foundation in 1999, the RDPC has helped shape international debates on regional policy and made the case for place-based policies to support all regions and cities to achieve their potential and improve well-being. The OECD, through the RDPC, articulates the benefit of regional development policies and distils information on what works, and what doesn't. International, national and subnational government policymakers rely on the RDPC's evidence, analysis, data and knowledge to adopt effective place-based policy in their countries, regions, cities and rural areas.

The RDPC represents 38 OECD member countries, as well as key partner countries. It meets twice a year to direct the regional development related work undertaken by OECD, share current policy practices and provide input on work undertaken by the OECD. The RDPC has three working parties on urban policy, rural policy and territorial indicators. It oversees an expert group on multi-level governance and public investment, and the OECD Water Governance Initiative.

Growing impact on regional, urban and rural policy, and multi-level governance

The RDPC has continued to increase awareness and engagement with its policy topics. Access to RDPC-related webpages, reports, datasets and social media has grown considerably in recent years.
