

Fare schedule - Paratransit



Effective July 1, 2023

Ride for free

New 65 and over: Free for residents of the agglomeration of Montréal for all modes in Zone A (bus, métro, train, REM and paratransit). For trips on the regular network only, the Free 65+, All Modes A fare must be loaded onto an OPUS card.

Children aged 11 and under can travel for free at all times while accompanied by a person aged 14 or older who is supervising them. The accompanying person must have a valid ticket.¹

You must show your Transport adapté photo OPUS card every time you use our paratransit service.

Transit fares are not sold on Transport adapté vehicles. Exact change is required for cash payment on vehicles.
