#### Why do we need the Fashion Fixer?

Why do we need the Fashion Fixer? The fashion industry (clothing and footwear) produces more than 8% of greenhouse gases and 20% of global wastewater annually. Producing clothes requires a huge amount of water. Did you know that it takes about 1,250 litres, or 330 gallons, of water to produce one cotton t-shirt, and about 7,500 litres to make a single pair of jeans – from the production of the cotton to the delivery of the final product to the store? And every second, the equivalent of one garbage truck of textiles is landfilled or burned. But being stylish does not have to be wasteful! By buying fewer clothes, shopping second-hand, or upcycling, i.e. creating new clothes out of old ones, you can save water and reduce waste.
