Zaragoza, Spain, 15-17 January 2015

About the Zaragoza Conference

The post-2015 international agenda for water will be decided in 2015. The UN-Water International Zaragoza Conference will start the year focusing on how to bring the agenda into action. A practical event on tools for implementation.

The UN-Water Conferences serve to prepare for World Water Day, focu-sing in 2015 on "water and sustainable development". More than 300 participants from United Nations Agencies and programmes, experts, representatives of the business community, governmental and non-governmental organizations will meet from 15 to 17 January 2015 in Zaragoza, Spain, to discuss the tools for implementing the post-2015 agenda for water. This is also the last year of the International Water for Life Decade so it is especially important for taking stock of and learning from achievements as well as planning the next steps.

The Focus on action/implementation

The Zaragoza Conference will provide a space for dialogue around some selected topics relevant to the implementation of the international agenda on water. The Conference will focus on a practical examination of what the necessary transformations are and how institutional change, technology, capacity development and financing can help develop appropriate joint responses. It will look at the essential similarities—learning from each other—and critical differences e.g. regional and country differences.

From Sustainable Development to a Sustainable Development Agenda for Water

The Conference will deal with some of the main implementation challenges related to four main themes (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene, Water Resources Management, Water Quality and Risks) in relation to the targets recommended by the Open Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals and UN-Water. These are:

The water goal and targets directly address the development aims and societies, promote human dignity and ensure achievements are sustainable over the long term leading to the following development outcomes, amongst others:

Healty people
Increased prosperity
Equitable societies
Protected ecosystems
Resilient communities

- Universal access to safe drinking water, sanitation and hygiene, improving water quality and raising service standards
- The sustainable use and development of water resources, increasing and sharing the availables benefits
- Robust and effective water governance with more effective institutions and administrative systems
- Improved water quality and wastewater management taking account of environmental limits
- Reduced risk of water-related disasters to protect vulnerable groups and minimize economic losses
