UNSSC is headquartered in Turin, Italy with an office in Bonn, Germany.

This Junior Individual Contractor position is located within the Peace and Security Hub of the UNSSC. The Junior Individual Contractor will be working under the Humanitarian-Development-Peace (HDP) Nexus, Children and Armed Conflict, and the Peacekeeping-Intelligence portfolios. The Junior Individual Contractor will be working with a wide range of UN partners in order to develop initiatives for knowledge sharing and capacity building for UN Staff and partners, primarily in the following thematic areas, amongst others:

- Designing, developing, reviewing, revising, and delivering course materials on:
 - Operationalizing the HDP Nexus;
 - Children and Armed Conflict (CAAC);
 - Peacekeeping-Intelligence (PKI);
 - Data Analytics for conflict prevention;
 - Humanitarian leadership;
 - Human Security;
 - Analysing and Engaging Non-State Armed Groups.

Responsibilities

Under the direct supervision of the Learning Portfolio Manager, the Junior Individual Contractor will be responsible for, but not limited to, the following:

- Support and provide expertise in the development and creation of HDP Nexus modules.
- Support in providing maintenance and further development of the HDP Nexus, CAAC and PKI portfolios, as well as other Peace and Security learning offerings;
- Co-coordinate communications efforts, through the drafting of information pieces and correspondence to be shared internally and externally;
- Provide technical support and expertise to e-learning development processes as required, through tasks such as:
 - Developing Articulate Rise Modules and ensuring their quality;
 - Conducting benchmarking and research as required to inform development;
 - Editing digital learning assets and resources (i.e. Articulate Rise modules, Elounge platform, Genially, Canva, PowerPoint, PowerBI); and
 - Contributing to the creation and quality control of infographics, multimedia and other e-learning assets and resources.
- Any other duties as required

Required Skills and Experience

Education:

Candidates having completed a University degree in International Relations, Political Science, Human Rights, Social Science or an area related to UNSSC programmatic priorities.

Experience:

Previous work experience with E-learning platforms and programmes is required. Previous work experience on analytical reporting and research is required. Experience creating and editing products using the Articulate suite, Moodle platforms, and Genially is a strong asset. Past experience working with/in areas relevant to the beforementioned learning portfolio is a strong asset.

Language competencies:

Fluency (written and oral) in English.

Computer skills:

Knowledge of online learning and social media tools; proven ability to use Microsoft Office, internet browsers and online platforms is required. Knowledge of Articulate Rise and/or the Adobe suite is required.
