## FROM OUR CEO

2019 was certainly another busy year at WPL, chock-full with inspiring programs, services and events for all ages – and some challenges. At the Main Library, we underwent a much needed mechanical upgrade project, installing a new HVAC system. Although we did our best to minimize the impact on customers, the Children's Department and program room had a lengthy closure, various pieces of the adult collection were not available, and it was often not a comfortable space. Despite all of this, we still had an increase in visitors with over 16,000 physical visitors system-wide per week. Over 293,000 customers accessed our Wi-Fi, and over 12,000 per week visited us virtually.

Our programs and events, from Welcome Ramadan to the Eco Year Challenge, Celebrate Diwali to Mini Comic Con, offered something for everyone and over 50,000 people enjoyed these initiatives. We are grateful for our community partners who assisted in making many of these programs possible.

Two very popular collections were introduced in 2019: Wi-Fi Hotspots and Board Games, with both in constant demand. Our digital collections continue to see growth with a 20% increase in circulation, while our library staff answered over 1,000 reference questions per week on a wide range of subjects. Our dedicated volunteers and staff in the Volunteer Library Services program visited 9 long term homes in Waterloo bringing not only 10,000 items but also introducing onsite programs which included teaching new technologies to the residents. Without our 233 volunteers, this service, and many other achievements, would not be possible. Our sincere thanks for your dedication.

Thank you to our amazing library staff who make all of this happen. Thank you to the Library Board whose leadership and support provides a solid foundation for the realization of our goals.

Thank you to our library customers whom we look forward to seeing every day. Our goal is to create endless possibilities for you at your public library.
